Federal Direct Loan Program

Colby-Sawyer participates in the Federal Direct Loan Program. Federal loans include Direct Subsidized and Unsubsidized Loans as well as Federal Direct PLUS Loans.

Federal Direct PLUS Loans — Federal Parent Loans

The Federal Direct PLUS Loan is a federal loan for parents of dependent undergraduate students. It is a fixed interest rate loan and has minimal credit requirements. Parents may borrow up to the cost of attendance minus any other financial aid the student receives.

THE DAN AND KATHLEEN HOGAN SPORTS CENTER

Hogan is fully equipped for athletic programs, student recreation and community fitness. The 63,000-square-foot building contains a multi-purpose fieldhouse with a suspended running/walking track, a six-lane swimming pool, locker rooms and aerobics studio, the Elizabeth Kind Van Cise Fitness Center, athletic department offices a conference room, the sports medicine clinic and racquet sports courts.

RAY CLIMBING WALL

The indoor climbing wall, located in Mercer Hall, is 29 feet tall and 20 feet wide. It has approximately 722 square feet of textured artificial rock climbing with routes set up for all skill levels and can accommodate up to three climbers at a time.

Transportation

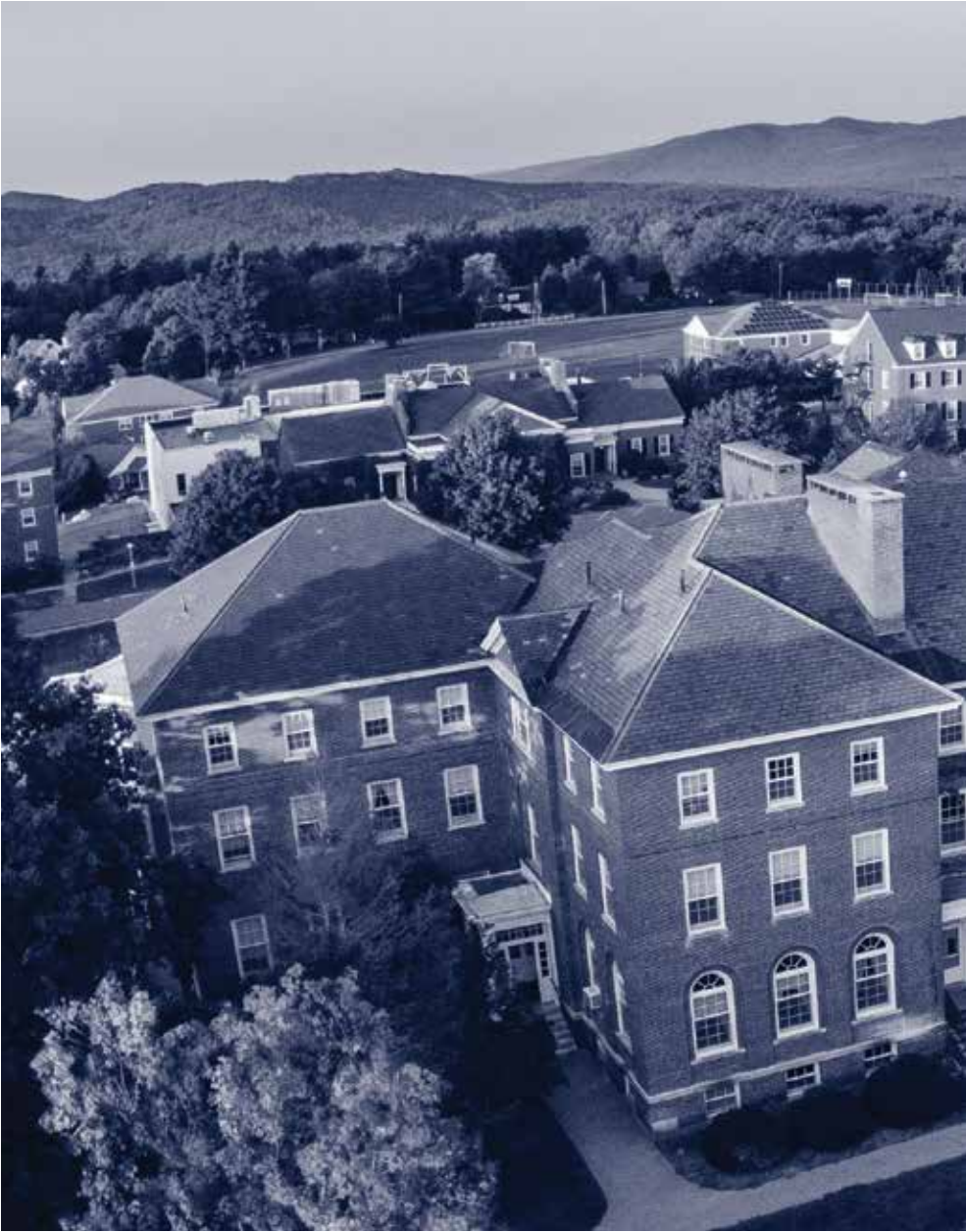
